

The Alamance Community School calendar shall comply with applicable laws concerning educational instruction time. ACS shall follow the minimum of 1,025 hours of instruction guideline set forth by 2012 Senate Bill 187.





A charter school is a **TUITION-FREE**, **PUBLIC SCHOOL of CHOICE** that is authorized by the State Board of Education and operated by an independent non-profit board of directors.

It has open enrollment and **CANNOT** discriminate in admissions, associated with any religion or religious group, or charge tuition.

It must admit any child residing in NC who is qualified to attend NC schools regardless of the school district where the child resides.

What is a NC Public Charter School?

 A public charter school is REQUIRED to participate in the state's accountability program, administer end-of-grade and end-of course tests, and provide data needed for NC School Report Cards.

State and local tax dollars are the primary funding sources for the charter school - "the money follows the child". Funding for the school comes from federal, state, and local taxes.

Charter schools **DO NOT** receive funds for **CAPITAL** expenses (building a school building, renovations, etc.).

ACS is Continuing to Grow



We have completed -

- Cottage #1 for 5th & 6th Graders
- Cottage #2 with 11 classrooms for 7th & 8th Grade and
- A full size Middle School Gym
- For 2025 2026 school year, ACS will serve Kindergarten -8th Grade
 - We have an **Articulation Agreement** with **West Triangle High School**, a new charter high school opening in 2026





What ACS Offers

Independent NC Public Charter School

- ACS is an independent charter school
- ACS is NOT a part of ABSS or any larger district
 School Calendar, Hours, & Inclement Weather
 - We have our own academic calendar, set our own hours and make our own independent inclement weather decisions
- ACS is NOT a part of ABSS or any larger district
 Breakfast & Lunch
 - ACS students eat lunch in their classrooms or picnic outside when weather permits
 - Students must bring a lunch from home or may take advantage of our Hot Lunch ordering program. This gives families the flexibility to order favorite foods from local vendors as frequently as they would like, without the commitment of ordering every school day.
 - ACS DOES NOT have an on-site cafeteria and we do not have a breakfast program

What ACS Does Not Offer



- Parents/Guardians must arrange their child's transportation or carpool to and from school.
 - ACS DOES NOT provide bus transportation


 ACS has an extensive book room for teachers to check out fiction

 Children can bring their lunch or purchase a lunch from the contracted vendors through My Hot Lunchbox. Children eat lunch in their classroom.


 Free & Reduced Lunches are provided for families who complete necessary paperwork and qualify.







At ACS Project Based Learning is an integral part of our philosophy and mission.

Students are presented with interesting, relevant and meaningful problems to solve.

Students complete 3 projects per year/ 1 per trimester.

We follow the NC Standard Course of Study (NCSCOS) and the Essential Standards in Science and Social Studies to determine each project.

NC STANDARD COURSE OF STUDY



Social Emotional Learning or SEL is a fundamental skill that is a focus at Alamance Community School. We follow the NC Guidance Essential Standards to support students in their cognitive, career, and personal/social development.

Students receive classroom guidance instruction on a variety of topics to meet their needs, including: empathy, feelings/emotions, self esteem, and much more!

Small groups and individual short term counseling are offered in addition to whole group instruction.

 Students rotate through and attend each special one time per week.









- 10 15 minutes of empathy &/or purposeful service will be built into each day

- Empathy & Service Projects may include making a Buddy Bench, starting a recycling program, collecting food for a local food pantry, & making cards for veterans












Student Ambassadors & Student Council:






